Assessment and Evaluation

Assessment is the day-to-day gathering of information on student growth and learning. We evaluate to understand where the student was, where they are now, and where they can go next. All of this helps to inform the teacher about the needs of the class and each individual, allowing for more effective teaching. Students will be assessed in a variety of ways including:

- observation/anecdotal records/checklists
- conferences/conversations
- work samples
- records of oral reading
- performance tasks
- questioning

Program Overview

Language Arts:

Throughout the English Language Arts program students become effective users of language for learning, for communication, and for enjoyment.

Mathematics:

Numbers:

Grade P- Count to 20, count backwards from 10, count starting anywhere from 0-10, compare numbers, partition numbers.

Grade 1- Count by 1s forward and backward to 100, by 2s forward to 20 and by 5s and 10s forward to 100. Addition and subtraction to 20.

Measurement:

Grade P- Compare length, mass, capacity, and volume.

Grade 1- Ordering and comparing length, mass, capacity, and volume.

Patterns and Relations:

Identifying, extending, reproducing, and creating patterns.

Geometry:

Grade P- Sort, build and describe 3D objects.

Grade 1- Sort and replicate 2D and 3D objects. Identify 2D shapes in 3D objects.

The following subjects will be integrated into the Language Art and Mathematics program:

- Health
- Social Studies
- Science
- Visual Arts

Technology Education: Students will use, with assistance, Chromebooks, Google Classroom, iPads, Bee Bots, and Dashes to support their learning.
